
LOUISE TAKES THE GTI SEA DOO SEASCOOTER TO EXTREMES

Louise Murray, filmmaker and photojournalist has just returned safely from her Arctic adventure.

Travelling to ever more remote parts of Inuit Canada (or Nunavut as it is now known) Louise took the **GTI Sea Doo Seascooter** to help in her underwater explorations.

In the tiny settlement of Arctic Bay, hundreds of miles north of the Arctic Circle, the Seascooter was strapped to a sled and pulled by Skidoo to the expedition's camp on 2 metre thick sea ice on Lancaster Sound.

Diving through a crack in the sea ice, the GTI Sea Doo Seascooter was tested in minus 1.6 degree C water.



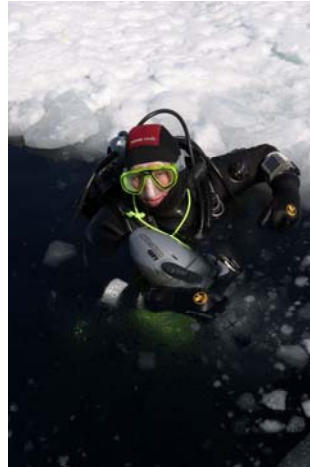

No problems with the freezing arctic conditions, the GTI pulled a 90 kilo dry suited diver and twenty kilos of diving weights, plus a heavy duty Aquatica broadcast quality camera strapped to the body of the Seascooter!

Unfortunately, Louise did not get the chance to photograph the rare belugas and narwhals - the sea ice remained frozen during the expedition.

The GTI Seascooter lived outside Louise's tent in air temperatures of down to minus twenty celsius and then ...48 hours later Louise (still with GTI Seascooter) was in the Egyptian Red Sea with day time temperatures of plus forty celsius and seawater temperatures of + 25C!
